"MEMBER SPOTLIGHT"

To Live is Christ

Many are familiar with the story about the pastor who was speaking to children and asked them, "What is brown and furry with a big bushy tail?" After a long pause, a child replied, "I know the answer is Jesus, but it sure sounds like a squirrel to me." When you ask children a question in Sunday School they often reply with the answer "Jesus!" even if that wasn't the answer the teacher was looking for. Yet, that simple answer is exactly what our world needs today! (Sadly, many are instead chasing squirrels) My family's life verse is Phil 1:21, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." The Greek phrase contains no verb. It simply says, "To live Christ, to die gain." After you boil it down, isn't that what Paul is saying here? The answer to life's questions in a nutshell is Jesus Christ.

To say "to live is Christ" is like the first of many dominoes. Romans 10:14 speaks of these dominoes, "How, then, can they call on him they have not believed in? And how can they believe without hearing about him? And how can they hear without a preacher?" In other words, believing in Jesus leads to learning about Jesus which then leads to teaching others. This is the basic way of making disciples, and making disciples is the purpose for the Church and every believer (Matt 28:19–20).

It is my privilege to serve as your associate pastor. I am here to encourage this process of believing, hearing, and teaching Jesus within the children's ministries, student ministries, and adult ministries as well as in the worship ministries. A challenge for you: how do *you* fill in the blank: "To Live is _____." If it is not Christ but something else, then you would have to change the last part, "To die is *loss*." The answer has to be Jesus Christ.

Pastor Phil

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As a 7-year-old in Mongolia, Jargalmaa (pictured left) described one particular day as "unexpected." After school, her teacher invited her to a church where she received her very first gift! This Operation Christmas Child shoebox gift included, among other fun toys, stationery, and a set of hairclips. Inside, she also found a letter that said, "You are valuable and so loved by God." Jargalmaa cherished this message because her parents and grandparents had never told her that they loved her.

Jargalmaa went on to participate in The Greatest Journey discipleship program where she especially appreciated the lessons about God as Creator. Later in 10th grade, she accepted Jesus as her Lord and Savior. Through her testimony, five of her family members and two close friends also made this life-changing decision.

Now15 years after receiving her shoebox gift, Jargalmaa, her husband, and two young children (pictured above) have recently moved to a new community where they are ministering to youth in hopes of starting a church.

"I would like to challenge people who are preparing shoebox gifts to also write a letter showing God's love," Jargalmaa said. "What's written there may be very simple, but those simple words could completely change somebody's life."
